STREWING / SCATTERING OF CREMATED ASHES

Policy and Procedure

INTRODUCTION

Groby Parish Council has now introduced a policy respecting the strewing or scattering of cremated ashes within the “Garden of Remembrance” at Groby Village Cemetery.

It is intended that this policy will cover the broad common issues and will be reviewed in line with the current Cemetery Regulations in force at Groby Village Cemetery. Please note that the “Garden of Remembrance” is not a cemetery, so once the ashes have been scattered, they are neither identifiable nor retrievable. Memorials in the form of tree, shrub planting, benches and memorial plaques are available in the Garden of Remembrance.

OBJECTIVES OF THE POLICY

The Council is seeking to ensure that it is adopting a clear, measurable and sympathetic approach to the management of its facilities, which will take account of the sometimes contrasting needs of a variety of cemetery users.

Any complaints relating to the implementation of the policy will be dealt with through the Council’s Corporate Complaints Procedure.

GENERAL

1. All applications to scatter ashes in the “Garden of Remembrance” should be completed on the **OFFICIAL SERVICE REQUEST FORM** and be signed by the applicant. Only applications from the next of kin or executor will be considered.
2. No memorials will be allowed on the site where ashes have been scattered. The next of kin or executor may purchase a memorial plaque, bench, tree or shrub to be placed within the Garden of Remembrance.
3. The council reserves the right to remove any memorials placed without the agreement of the council.

PROCEDURE - GARDEN OF REMEMBRANCE

The passing of close relatives or friends is always a time of sorrow and stress, but within the quiet and peaceful grounds of Groby Village Cemetery, everything has been done to make the occasion as reverent, as consoling and as respectful as possible.

Groby Parish Council has created a "Garden of Remembrance", which although not consecrated, is dedicated to the dead of all religions and non-believers. Bereaved people can visit this garden for some quiet solace and contemplation and memorials in the form of tree or shrub planting is available.

The cremated remains may be strewn in one of the four designated areas within the Garden of Remembrance.

The ashes are not allowed to be scattered in one solid mass on the ground and will be scattered evenly, covered with light soil and aggregate shortly after the strewing to help preserve the beauty of the strewing area and encourage the remains to return to the earth.

The area in which the cremated remains are strewn is then recorded in the register for future reference. It is important to consider that once scattering has taken place **cremated remains cannot be removed, individually located, or marked within the scattering areas**. Cremated remains scattered in the Gardens of Remembrance are not contained in a casket or urn, and only a general location is recorded.

Where relatives of the deceased have previously been scattered within the Garden of Remembrance, it is possible for other relatives to be strewn in the same area following their cremation (the full name and date of death of the previous deceased relative will be required).

Appointments to witness the strewing of Cremated Remains

The strewing of your loved one's cremated remains in a designated area can be done by a member of our staff, or carried out by you and witnessed by a member of staff.

An appointment can be arranged for a mutually convenient date and time to allow relatives to attend and witness the final disposal of the cremated remains within the Garden of Remembrance. (Monday to Friday 9.30pm to 3.00pm).

Should the relatives desire, a minister may be engaged to read a short form of service. This would be arranged by and at the expense of the applicant.

On arrival a member of the Cemetery staff will meet the family.

If the cremated remains are delivered to the cemetery at the time of the appointment, the Cemetery Sexton will need to transfer the cremated remains into a specially designed container, before strewing can take place.

The Cemetery Sexton will strew the cremated remains in the presence of relatives.

However, if a family member would like to strew the cremated remains themselves the Parish Council Cemetery Office should be informed, whereupon instructions will be provided to the family prior to the strewing taking place.

No memorials will be permitted in the area where the strewing has taken place, although floral tributes can be left in floral tribute area. Floral tributes are left for exactly 2 weeks before disposal.

At times such as Fathers' day and Mothers' day we leave flowers an extra week. At Christmas we leave Christmas wreaths until the last day in January when the grounds are cleared.

It is a criminal offence to dispose of cremated remains within the cemetery without permission.

Leased memorials

As it is not possible to have a memorial placed where the cremated remains are scattered, our memorial scheme provides a lasting, commemorative tribute to loved ones, and is available within the Garden of Remembrance in the form of engraved granite plaques displayed on the raised sides of the water feature, the scattering beds and rose beds.

The plaques, measure 6" x 4" (150mmx100mm) and can have up to six lines of inscription engraved and lettered gold. There is a space for a maximum of 116 letters, spaces or figures on each line and a grid is provided on the application form for you to map your requirements within these limits. No deviation from material, colour of plaque or inscription can be permitted. The final size of the lettering will be determined by the number of characters on each line.

Memorials are available for leasing over ***an initial twenty year*** period during which time they will be on display in the Garden of Remembrance. Within this period, new replacement plaques can be ordered to incorporate other names. A charge will be made for amended plaques. Plaques are placed in the Garden of Remembrance within approximately four weeks of ordering. The leases will not commence until the plaque has been fitted. Plaques will be allocated in strict rotation and once fitted cannot be re-sited.

At the end of the initial period, the lease can be renewed for a further ten to twenty years on payment of a further lease fee. If the option to renew is not taken up at the end of elapsed period the plaque will be removed and the space reallocated. Spaces for plaques cannot be reserved in advance but, as stated above, plaques can be changed to incorporate other names.

Because of the limited space available within the Garden of Remembrance and to protect the aesthetic appearance of the scheme, floral tributes and other items cannot be accommodated and will be removed. However, floral tributes may be placed within the designated Floral Tribute Area situated within the Garden of Remembrance. The public's co-operation in this regard would be much appreciated.

Wall plaque



The granite wall plaque is available to lease for an initial period of 20 years. The price includes the purchase of the granite plaque (6"x4.") and a total of 116 letters of inscription.

When the lease is due to expire, you will be contacted and invited to renew the lease for a further period of 10 or 20 years.

Rose with plaque



The roses are already planted and established ready for dedication. All the roses are available to be leased for an initial period of 5 years.

The plaque and stainless steel spike is included in the purchase price. If the lease on your rose is due to expire, you will be contacted by post inviting you to renew the lease for a further period of 5 years.

PLEASE NOTE – ♦ The Rose shrubs do on occasions fall victim to disease and need to be removed. Should this occur we will plant a new rose shrub as close to the original as possible.

Individual Memorial tree

This memorial is available to lease for an initial period of 5 years and includes the purchase of a plaque and stainless steel spike. There are several trees available for dedication within the Garden of Remembrance. If the lease on your memorial tree is due to expire, you will be contacted by post inviting you to renew the lease for a further period of 5 years.

PLEASE NOTE – ♦ Although uncommon, trees do, on occasions fall victim to disease and need to be felled. We will endeavour to plant a new tree as close to the original as possible. Where the original tree was mature, a stump will be left above ground, the grantee has the choice to place their plaque adjacent to the newly planted tree or the stump of the original.

Memorial Bench

A limited number of Memorial Benches are available to lease for an initial period of 20 years. The price includes the purchase of the plaque (150mmx100mm) and 5 lines of inscription (116 characters). When the lease is due to expire, you will be contacted and invited to renew the lease for a further period of 10 years. (The fee is dependent on whether the bench is in a safe and sound condition).

If you would like to discuss the memorial options with a member of the Parish Council staff, please contact the Parish office and ask to speak to a member of staff.

Cremation Scattering Methods

Raking Ashes: the ashes are poured from the scattering urn evenly on loose soil and raked into the ground at the conclusion of the scattering ceremony. This is the most common form of scattering ashes within the Garden of Remembrance.

Trenching Ashes: this is done on one of the raised beds within the Garden of Remembrance when a shallow trench or groove is dug in the soil. The trench is filled from the scattering urn and raked over at the conclusion of the ceremony. You can get creative and dig the person's name in the soil, maybe inside a heart, then fill the void with the ashes. If it is not too windy, candles can go in the ground alongside the trench for a more spiritual feel (these will be removed by the Cemetery Sexton post ceremony after a period of time)

Ringing Ashes: This is when a ring is formed in the raised bed around an object or even a group of objects, it can be with or without a trench. The scattering urn will need to be held close to the ground when pouring the ring.

Casting Ashes: is the act of simply tossing the ashes to the wind. Usually done by one individual while others look on. Care and consideration of others should be used when casting. Check the direction of the wind and cast down wind. The ashes are mostly made up of dense sand like matter and will quickly fall to the ground but some of it will be a fine powder and this will become airborne forming a cloud. Casting can also be done as a group. People can take turns scattering a little at a time.

Planning your Service

As you fulfil your loved one's wishes to be cremated and scattered, you may want to have close friends and family who are attending the scattering each read a poem or verse. We have enclosed some ideas for you.
